**City of Niles Ordinances for Littering, Disorderly Person
and Disturbing the Peace**

Those persons found guilty of the offenses below shall be subject to fines and costs as assessed by the courts.

LITTERING

Sec. 58-65. - Littering.

No person, without the consent of the public authority having supervision and control of public property or of the owner or lawful occupant of private property, shall dump, deposit, place, throw or leave, or cause or permit the dumping, depositing, placing, throwing or leaving, of litter on any public or private property or waters other than property and receptacles designated and set apart for such purposes. The term "litter," as used in this section, shall mean all rubbish, refuse, waste material, garbage, offal, paper, glass, metals, cans or other metal containers, bottles, trash, debris or other foreign substance.

DISORDERLY PERSONS

Sec. 58-162. – Disorderly persons.

A person is a disorderly person if that person is any of the following:

- (1) A person who commits acts of prostitution;
- (2) A person who engages in an illegal occupation or business;
- (3) A person who is engaged in indecent or obscene conduct in a public place;
- (4) A person found loitering in a house of ill fame or prostitution or place where prostitution or lewdness is practiced, encouraged, or allowed with intent to engage in, aid, abet or further prostitution;
- (5) A person who knowingly loiters in or about a place where an illegal occupation or business is being conducted with the intent to engage in, aid, abet or further the illegal conduct or occupation;
- (6) A person who loiters in or about a police station, police headquarters building, county jail or annex thereof, hospital, court building, or any other public building or place for the purpose of soliciting employment of legal services or the services of sureties upon criminal recognizances;
- (7) A person who is found jostling or roughly crowding people unnecessarily in a public place.

DISTURBING THE PEACE

Sec. 58-163. - Disturbing the peace.

No person shall disturb, tend to disturb, incite or aid in disturbing the public peace by loud, violent, tumultuous, offensive or obstreperous conduct, or shall make or participate in making any improper noise or disturbance, riot or breach of peace, or shall engage in any illegal or improper act, and no person shall knowingly permit any such conduct upon any premises owned or possessed by him or under his control.
